



Humaniti's presence in Gaza

Given our longstanding presence in Gaza, Humaniti was able to respond immediately in October 2023. Our partners mobilized and started delivering critical support from day one. We are constantly adjusting and scaling efforts, in response to unpredictable challenges in this extremely high-stakes environment.

Delivering aid safely and promptly in a war zone is a major challenge, but we remain committed to navigating obstacles, minimizing risks to aid workers and making sure that relief is reaching the most vulnerable survivors.

Our response is also focused on displaced Palestinians who have sought refuge throughout various camps in Cairo, Egypt. We are providing a range of aid including food, water, healthcare and educational support for the growing list of refugees in this neighbouring region.

Since October 2023 we have brought strength and support to many thousands of Gazans who are experiencing unimaginable hardships, and in 2025 we have continued to impact thousands all across the region through a broad range of humanitarian initiatives.



October 2025





Trucks full of hope: 18,000 vulnerable lives impacted

Famine continues to be a devastating reality for survivors in Gaza. With our partners on the ground, Humaniti is rapdily delivering food supplies to as many hungry survivors as possible, particularly those at a heightened risk including children, pregnant women, the elderly and people with disabilities.

In October, we mobilized three truck convoys from West Bank to Gaza. Each truck carried 1,000 food packs full of essential staples including four, rice, olive oil, sugar, tuna, beans, cheese, milk, thyme, salt and tea. Each pack feeds a family for two weeks.

40,330 individuals relieved and replenished with clean water every day for 10 days

24,666 individuals nourished with hot meals served daily for a period of 10 days

88,200 vulnerable individuals (seniors, children, pregnant women and those with a disability) provided holistic support including emergency food packs, hot meals, medical assistance, and clean water

25,000 displaced and returning families comforted and nourished with food baskets, clean water and hot meals

87 Gazan refugees accepted into Canadian graduate programs supported for six months before studies begin

A convoy of comfort: 20,000 survivors nourished

Gazans are experiencing the hardships of this war on an empty stomach. This is an extremely challenging reality for anyone, particularly children, the elderly, widows and those with disabilities. In September, we mobilized four truck convoys from the West Bank to Gaza, each truck carrying 1,000 food packs. These packs of staple supplies not only provided immediate relief, but helped these vulnerable families restore a sense of dignity with the ability to prepare meals at home for a period of two weeks.





August 2025

Gaza Strip

40,330 individuals supported with clean water daily for 10 days (20 litres per family)

24,666 individuals comforted and sustained with hot, nutritious meals over a period of 10 days

North Gaza

8,000 individuals sustained with parcels of dry food items, providing families with a month's worth of staple nutrition

North and South of Gaza

19,000 individuals nourished via 90 large pots of nutritious food


5,000 individuals given relief through 50 clean water tank deliveries, totalling 750,000 litres


3,760 individuals (750 families) supported with nutritious food and clean water supplies

Prioritizing the most precious: 2,500 orphans supported

Caring for children who have no support system will continue to be a primary focus of our work in Gaza. These brave young souls face so many challenges and are in dire need of assistance from all angles. By the end of this project, which launched in February, 2,500 orphaned children will have received \$50 cash vouchers on a monthly basis for basic essentials. 500 of them will have received a \$70 voucher for clothing and 552 orphaned children will have received specialized medical interventions based on their specific needs.







Removing barriers for refugees: 54 Palestinian refugee students supported

Those who have left Gaza looking for brighter days are still met with a host of challenges once they arrive in a new country. In March 2025 we were able to facilitate the settlement of 50 Palestinian students who were forced to leave Gaza and were accepted into Canadian graduate programs. Your donations enabled us to support operational costs including four staff salaries for six months, as well as cover visa fees, university application fees, CAQ fees, legal and immigration consultations, and biometric fees.





North Gaza

6,500 displaced individuals in emergency shelters nourished with hot meals

5,000 orphans supported with a \$50 monthly cash stipend

4,000 displaced families (20,000 individuals) replenished with clean water

1,230 families (6,150 individuals) supported with food parcels

6,370 displaced families (31,850 individuals) nourished with frozen meat parcels

500 individuals supported with a clean water well

300 families (1,500 individuals) received daily meals from two charity kitchens

Healing the displaced: 400 injured individuals treated

9 out of 10 Gazans are living in tents or makeshift shelters and many of them are coping with debilitating injuries of war without a doctor or nurse in sight. Their situation is critical. Your donations have made it possible for us to reach hundreds of survivors living in tents, displacement centres and unfit housing, and treat their wounds and injuries with mobile medical services. It has meant the difference between life and death for them.





May 2025

North Gaza

5,000 orphans supported with a \$50 monthly cash stipend

Egypt

1,800 refugee families from Gaza (9,000 individuals) nourished with essential food parcels

200 refugee orphans from Gaza received gifts and Eidiyah (cash gifts)

100 refugee orphans from Gaza and their guardians (230 total) comforted with hot meals

30 refugee medical students from Gaza supported with tuition payments, enabling them to complete their studies

170 refugee patients from Gaza received critical surgeries

160 refugee patients from Gaza supported with medical aid, medicine, and devices

Keeping learning alive:314 students and teachers in class

Through the first half of 2025 we established two education centres serving approximately 150 students each. Provisions included tables, chairs, whiteboards, markers, school bags and sportswear. Your donations enabled us to organize recreational activities, psychological support, and provide salaries for 14 qualified teachers. The project also involved media coverage to highlight the importance of educational continuity in conflict zones.

Serving up strength: 72,600 individuals nourished

One of the best, most immediate ways to bring strength and comfort to a survivor in Gaza is with a hot, nutritious meal. Throughout April 2025, we conducted two projects that distributed 5,186 hot meals every day over the course of one week. Each meal provided nourishment for two people, with each project feeding 42,000 and 30,600 individuals respectively.

450 children benefited from Eid clothes, psychosocial activities and celebratory events

South Gaza

Letting hope flow: 125,000 individuals benefited

Gazans are experiencing historic levels of suffering, all without a drop of clean water. They can't quench their thirst, bathe or cook without clean water access. Since 2023 we have been bringing clean water to as many survivors as humanly possible through different methods from repairing water wells to installing solar panels for desalination plants. In March 2025 we delivered 1,112 cubic metres of water (1 cubic metre = 1,000 gallons) via water trucks to displaced families suffering from extreme water scarcity.

1,000 children provided with Eid clothes during Ramadan

315 vulnerable families (1,575 individuals) supported with Zakat Al-Fitr via \$100 shopping vouchers

800 refugee families from Gaza (4,000 individuals) nourished with essential food supplies

300 refugee children from Gaza given new shoes and clothing

30 injured refugees from Gaza healed with in-kind assistance, food parcels and financial support

200 refugee women from Gaza supported with essential clothing and shoes



Stabilizing spaces: 1,800 individuals protected

It's so easy to take for granted the four walls that surround us, the roof over our heads, even the floor we stand on. Thousands of Gazans lost all of their belongings and their homes in an instant, left to survive in tents that were tattered and torn, or no tents at all. One of many shelter projects we've led in 2025 provided 50 new tents to families without shelter, and upgraded 250 existing tents with protective tarpaulins to enhance safety and liveability.





February 2025

11,000 individuals benefiting from clean water access via 220 trucks

2,040 families (10,200 individuals) strengthened with nutritious meals

56 families (280 individuals) given light and power with solar energy panels installed in their homes

The most vulnerable of all:

5,000 orphans supported

Gazans of all ages have experienced unimaginable trauma since 2023 but no one is at greater risk than the thousands of orphaned children who have been left to fend for themselves. We are working tirelessly to support as many of these heroic little souls as possible. Beginning in February we launched a project to support thousands of Gazan orphans with monthly cash stipends for a period of six months to ensure they have nutritious food, clean water, a safe place to lay their heads, and other supports to bring them joy and comfort.



A holy helping: 10,000 individuals nourished

Suhoor is the pre-dawn meal eaten by Muslims before the start of the daily fast during Ramadan, but so many households in Gaza are unable to take part in this sacred tradition because they have no food at all. Thanks to our donors we were able to provide 2,000 Ramadan Suhoor food parcels to families over the month of Ramadan. Each parcel included fava beans, sugar, tea, sage, cheese, thyme, and sesame oil.







January 2025

North Gaza

Thousands nourished with hot meal pots and bags of flour

1,593 displaced individuals provided hot meals

1,000 patients provided free dental imaging services

3,000 patients supported with essential healthcare services including exams and follow-ups

500 displaced families (2,500 individuals) protected with winter clothing

1,500 vulnerable women given comprehensive gynecological and obstetric care

700 children under six years old nourished with food supplements

300 displaced students and 10 teachers benefited from temporary learning spaces

7,500 individuals relieved with clean water via 150 trucks

Materials for healing: 10,000 patients benefitting

There are so many people suffering from grave injury and the need for infrastructure to treat them is immense. Through our partnership with the Friends of Patients Association we were able to provide a fully equipped ambulance, supply medications and essential medical supplies, as well as furniture and office equipment to serve both patients and staff. Additionally your donations helped us rehabilitate the hospital's exterior facade with plastering, painting and waterproofing.

454 displaced families (2,273 individuals) nourished with hot meals for displaced families

333 displaced families (1,665 individuals) protected with waterproof tents

Thousands benefitting from a medical point providing general medicine, pediatrics, internal medicine, burn/injury treatment/dressings, and a pharmacy

450 families (2,250 individuals) benefited from hot meal pots over 30 days

300 families (1,500 individuals) benefited from food parcels and firewood for cooking

1,000 displaced students benefited from the establishment and operation of a school


Thousands of individuals were provided access to clean water wells fueled by 2,500 litres of diesel fuel

RUTFs to tackle famine:

Typically, this solution is for children under five years old and lactating mothers, however, these RUTFs have been designed to support all ages throughout the current famine in Gaza.
